About Latina Action Day

For 25 years, Hispanas Organized for Political Equality (HOPE) has convened 400 Latina leaders from all regions of California in Sacramento for an annual public policy issues conference: Latina Action Day. This one day conference is designed to facilitate dialogue between Latina corporate and community leaders and elected officials on public policy affecting Latinas in California. Through town-halls and workshops, HOPE presents up to date information, analysis, and access to decision makers on critical issues such as access to healthcare, higher education, and the California state budget.

Why invest in Latinas and HOPE

Latinxs are estimated to possess \$1.7 trillion in purchasing power, and account for nearly half of the population growth in the U.S. (Nielsen). One in 5 people in California are Latina and 50% of all children in K-12 are Latinx in California (HOPE's ESLR 2017).

GENERAL SESSION

HOPE® is a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization committed to ensuring political and economic parity for Latinas through leadership, advocacy, and education to the benefit of all communities and the status of women.

OUR WORK

Leadership

HOPE Leadership Institute® (HLI)

The HLI is the first and only statewide leadership program specifically designed for Latinas in California. The goal of the Institute is to train Latinas in vital leadership and advocacy skills, enabling them to create fundamental change within their local neighborhoods and across California. Over 520 Latina professionals have completed the HLI.

HOPE Binational Public Service Fellowship

The HOPE Binational Fellowship, launched in the summer of 2018, is an executive leadership program for outstanding Latina professionals who, through increased competence in national and global economic and security issues, are in a position to make urgent and long-lasting improvements in the lives of Latinas in the United States and all communities.

HOPE Youth Leadership Program® (HYLP)

The HYLP is a statewide development program designed to prepare low-income, high school-age Latinas for a self-sufficient future that will allow for economic and political parity through a college education. The objectives of the HYLP include college preparation, financial empowerment, enhanced civic participation, and the promotion of healthy living. HYLP participants have a 98% High School graduation rate and 92% enroll in college.

HOPE College Leadership Program (HCLP)

Piloted in 2016, the HCLP is designed to engage Latina college students and recent grads (age 18-24) to support them in developing their leadership. advocacy and professional skills through training and access to a professional network. The goal of HCLP is to ensure college completion and successful workforce integration.

Latina Action Day® (Sacramento)

Mobilizes Latina leaders statewide to voice their concerns on issues impacting Latinas and their communities through a full day policy conference and capitol visits.

Latina Empowerment Days (Statewide)

Through an annual series of workshops throughout California, Latina Empowerment Days aim to identify, train, and mentor a powerful network of Latinas about important issues affecting them, their families, and communities. Empowerment Days equip Latinas to advocate for themselves on issues such as economic parity, civic engagement and access to affordable healthcare.
